Computer-delivered, Self-Report, Substance Use Assessment for Adolescents"

All of our products are research-tested, and in April, the results from our NIDA/NIH grant-supported research to develop and validate the Comprehensive Health Assessment for Teens (CHAT) were published in Substance Use & Misuse (Vol. 46, No. 6: Pages 781-794).

"Reliability and validity of CHAT's six problem dimensions were evaluated in two studies we conducted from 2003 to 2008," says Albert Villapiano, Ed.D., Vice President of Clinical Development at Inflexxion and one of the authors of the article.

"CHAT allows for real-time data-capturing and provision of reports for clinicians and administrators, while reducing the resources needed for the assessment process (e.g., clinician time). Such technology-based infrastructure supports the current emphasis on continuity of care across service systems to improve client outcomes as well as build efficiencies to reduce healthcare costs." The current study was conducted to construct and validate a computer-delivered, multimedia, substance use self-assessment for

adolescents. Reliability and validity of six problem dimensions were evaluated in two studies, conducted from 2003 to 2008. Study 1 included 192 adolescents from five treatment settings throughout the United States (N = 142) and two high schools from Greater Boston, Massachusetts (N = 50). Study 2 included 356 adolescents (treatment: N = 260; school: N = 94). The final version of Comprehensive Health Assessment for Teens (CHAT) demonstrated relatively strong psychometric properties. The limitations and implications of this study are noted. This study was supported by an SBIR grant.

Participate in a clinical study of "Facing the Future" adult relapse prevention program

Facing the Future is an online, tailored relapse prevention program for adults in substance abuse treatment and in early recovery. It is being developed with the support of a Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) grant from the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA). It is intended to be used as a supplement to ongoing treatment for a client, and an easy-to-access resource once the client is out of treatment.

The aim of the program is to help adult clients to achieve: 1) improved skill set to cope and manage the challenges of early recovery and maintaining sobriety; 2) improved ability to use the Internet to find resources for wrap-around services; and 3) improved treatment compliance and alliance with counselors.

We plan to test the program at outpatient treatment centers nationwide in a 6-month field trial that will start in August 2011. We will be recruiting counselors and clients from each treatment center for this study, and will provide compensation to all participants for their time, resources, and efforts.
